In addition, there was a hazmat drill at the old SMFR station #3 on C-shift, and three classes taught for the crews on the new Smith Detection equipment. Lastly, a Tactical Chemistry class starts this month and continues into the month of December.

During the month of December Smith Detection taught the hazmat team members how to use Southern Manatee's new detection equipment. In addition, the Florida State Bureau of Radiation Control taught hazmat team members, and ½ of on-duty crews, tech level radiological response. This class was scheduled 1 year in advanced due to the high demand of the instructors, was free of charge, and offers 8 hours of CEU's through the Florida State Fire College towards state recertifications. Next, crews completed classes on Target Solutions towards EMT, Instructor and Inspector recertification and to satisfy Insurance Services Office (ISO) training requirements. Also this month, Chief Gorski taught classes to all crews on the recent changes to the SMFR BLS protocols. During the month of January the Chief will be administering a BLS protocol exam. Lastly, during the month of December a purchase was made to acquire the complete IFSTA Library (26 books) to be placed in the SMFR library for all personnel to check out and use. In addition, 6 of the newest IFSTA Essentials manuals were purchased to be distributed to the stations for daily and refresher training. It is anticipated that additional manuals will be purchased later in the year.
