During the month of March, S.A.V.E. classes #6 - #12 were taught. This is the active shooter victim recovery team concept being taught to all public safety agencies. The class is a total of 8 hours divided into two 4 hour classes and taught to all crews at Southern Manatee Fire Rescue. In addition, all Fire Departments, EMS and most Law Enforcement (includes MSO) are receiving this training. Also, the Southern Manatee Fire & Rescue Field Training Officer's continued teaching their personnel on the Denver Drill. This is a technique developed by Denver Fire Department, after they had a Line of Duty Death, to efficiently extricate a downed Firefighter inside a structure. In addition, all crews were given hazmat training by Lt. Bloski on Monitoring and sampling equipment and a drill was conducted on A-shift on hazmat risk and assessment.
