During the month of May crews reviewed the new SMFR exposure control plan, and the severe weather and hurricane policies. In addition, crews continue working towards their 2 year Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) recertification process, utilizing Target solutions and reviewing the SMFR Basic Life Support protocols. Lastly, some of the crews toured the Waste Management Facility to attend a class on their new Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fill station and apparatus. There will eventually be 70 new trash trucks utilizing CNG fuel. Currently there are beer delivery trucks on the roads using CNG. This fuel system offers some unique and dangerous challenges when the vehicle is on fire. B/C Gould will be teaching 6 classes over three days to all crews, during the beginning of June, on emergency response to CNG.
